Stacey Doré is vice president and general counsel of Luminant, a competitive power generation subsidiary of Energy Future Holdings Corp. Luminant's activities include plant, mine, wholesale marketing and trading, and development operations

Her primary responsibilities include:

- Coordinating and ensuring timely and efficient delivery of all legal services for Luminant
- Working closely with other senior leaders to develop the company's strategy for addressing numerous environmental, permitting and other regulatory challenges
- Ensuring a robust regulatory compliance program for Luminant Energy, Luminant's wholesale marketing and trading business
- Ensuring the provision of professional and efficient contract administration services to Luminant Energy
- Managing the legal department's outside counsel relationships, including implementing and enforcing the company's external counsel policies and guidelines and tracking and controlling counsel budgets and expenses

Doré oversees a staff of approximately 20 professionals providing legal, compliance and contract administration services to Luminant. The team is highly respected and possesses decades of experience in matters pertinent to Luminant business operations.

Prior to becoming Luminant's general counsel, Doré served for three years as associate general counsel in charge of litigation for EFH, where she managed all litigation for EFH, Luminant and TXU Energy. For her work at EFH, the Association of Corporate Counsel and *DCEO Magazine* named Doré as Outstanding In-House Counsel in 2010.

Before joining EFH in August 2008, Doré was counsel with the Dallas office of Vinson & Elkins LLP, where she engaged in a business litigation practice for 11 years with a focus on antitrust law and media defense work. Through the Lawyer on Loan program, she also worked for a short time at the Dallas district attorney's office, where she tried criminal misdemeanor cases.

In addition to her responsibilities at Luminant, Doré serves on the steering committee for the United Way Women of Tocqueville and serves on the boards of Girls Inc. and Grace Academy of Dallas. She is also a 2010 graduate of the Dallas Regional Chamber's Leadership Dallas program and a 2011 graduate of the General Counsel Forum's Institute for Leadership in the Law.

Doré received her law degree *cum laude* from Harvard Law School in 1997 and served as an intern for Texas Supreme Court Chief Justice Tom Phillips before entering private practice. She is licensed to practice in Texas and Louisiana and has been admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court. She has also served as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Southwestern Louisiana, where she taught communications law. Doré graduated *summa cum laude* from the University of Southwestern Louisiana, where she earned a bachelor's degree in journalism.
