# **Closure Alternatives Analysis Addendum**

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**Updated Information Regarding Concerns of Residents Associated  
with the Closure Alternatives  
[Illinois Administrative Code Section 845.710(b)(4)]**

This document presents an addendum to the Closure Alternatives Assessment (CAA) for the Ash Pond at Illinois Power Resources Generating, LLC's (IPRG) Edwards Power Plant property in Peoria County, Illinois, which was submitted to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) in July 2022 (Gradient, 2022). The CAA was prepared to meet the requirements of Section 845.710 of the Illinois Administrative Code (Title 35, Subtitle G, Chapter I, Subchapter j, Part 845; IEPA, 2021), which requires the development of a CAA prior to undertaking closure activities. The CAA evaluated two specific closure scenarios for the Ash Pond: Closure-in-Place (CIP) with consolidation and Closure-by-Removal with Off-Site coal combustion residual (CCR) Disposal (CBR-Offsite) using a wide range of criteria, including the efficiency, reliability, and ease of implementation of the closure scenario, and its potential positive and negative short- and long-term impacts on human health and the environment (Gradient, 2022; IEPA, 2021).

One specific requirement of Section 845.710 of the Illinois Administrative Code [845.710(b)(4)] relates to the ability of the closure scenario to address concerns raised by the local community:

The closure alternatives analysis must examine the following for each closure alternative...  
[t]he degree to which the concerns of the residents living within communities where the CCR will be handled, transported and disposed of are addressed by the closure method (IEPA, 2021).

The CAA submitted in 2022 (Gradient, 2022) evaluated the closure alternatives with respect to this requirement and concluded that both closure scenarios addressed residents' concerns regarding impacts to groundwater and surface water quality. The CAA identified CIP as the most appropriate closure scenario for the Ash Pond based on all criteria that were evaluated consistent with the requirements of Section 845.710. A public meeting was held on May 25, 2022, during which the results of the CAA were discussed, and community questions were answered.

This addendum provides updated information related to the CAA requirement to address the concerns of the local community [845.710(b)(4)]. Since the initial submission of the CAA, IPRG has received hundreds of letters from residents who live in communities near the Site and along adjacent transportation corridors (Figure A.1), town officials, and labor organizations. The letters, which are attached at the end of this addendum, voice support for the CIP alternative and raise concerns associated with the CBR-Offsite alternative.

Specifically, local residents and town officials consider the CIP closure plan to be "environmentally responsible" and "better" than the CBR-Offsite alternative. Moreover, they support the move towards renewable energy generation associated with the proposed site re-development plan under the CIP alternative (a utility-scale solar facility that will be installed on the capped impoundment). The residents, town officials, and labor organizations are also excited by the economic benefits (*e.g.*, creation of additional jobs for local workers and the increase in property tax revenue) associated with the re-development plan under the CIP alternative.

On the other hand, residents and town officials are concerned about the adverse effects associated with the CBR-Offsite scenario, which would involve removing and transporting millions of cubic yards of coal ash offsite over a period of 15 years. The concerns raised by residents and town officials include the increased traffic and safety risks, and noise and diesel pollution (from hauling coal ash on local roads and highways), which would "diminish the quality of life for residents who live near the plant or the coal ash transportation corridors" (*e.g.*, see letter from the Village of Bartonville board of trustees). In particular, many residents who live along the potential truck haul routes are concerned about these risks and have voiced their concerns (Figure A.1). Town officials are also worried about the increased wear and tear on local roads.


As can be seen from the attached letters, there is overwhelming support from the local community for the CIP alternative.

In our capacity as a Village of Bartonville Board and as residents who would be impacted by the transportation of coal ash in the region, we are contacting you about the Agency's consideration of the impoundment closure plan submitted by the Edwards Power Plant.

What concerns us is the impact the alternative closure by removal plan would impose on the region for the next two decades. Picking up and moving the coal ash to another location presents its own unique risks and challenges. The intensity of removal operations under this alternative closure plan would broadly impact our region in ways that would diminish the quality of life for residents that live near the plants or the coal ash transportation corridors.

Based on the volume of material needing to be transported offsite under closure by removal, approximately 321,000 truckloads would travel 13.5 million miles on our local roads and highways to transport the coal ash to the offsite commercial landfill.

At any point along the coal ash transportation route, a truck involved in the removal operation would pass by every 3 to 4 minutes, 10 hours a day, for up to 15 years.

The closure by removal plan imposes burdens of increased traffic and safety risk, wear and tear on roads, noise, and diesel pollution in the region. There are inherent risks with the excavation and transportation of 4.4 million cubic yards of coal ash across public roads that are not present when the material is left and properly enclosed on site of the former coal plant.

We oppose the alternative plan of closure by removal of the Edwards Power Plant because of the negative impacts this method will have on our area communities. I encourage the Agency to weigh the negative impacts of closure by removal and the local opposition to this alternative proposal.

The Edwards Power Plant's proposed impoundment closure plan attains all protection standards. Additionally, Vistra Corp.'s Illinois subsidiaries have proposed to build a new utility-scale solar installation atop the reclaimed acres at the impoundment. The renewable development will create good paying jobs during its construction and property taxes for the region once operational. Every brownfield acre reused at a coal plant site for renewables is an acre preserved for other uses, such as agriculture or conservation.

We support the impoundment closure plan submitted by the Edwards Power Plant and encourage its permitting by the Agency.

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

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

DEAR DIRECTOR KIM,

I WOULD LIKE TO EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO MEET WITH THE LOCAL REPRESENTATIVES OF THE VISTRA CORPORATION AND REVIEW THEIR CLOSURE PLANS FOR THE EDWARDS POWER PLANT. AS THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ILLINOIS 93RD LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT, IT IS MY RESPONSIBILITY TO CAREFULLY CONSIDER THE OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO SAFELY CLOSE THE PLANT AND MINIMIZE ANY NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY I REPRESENT.

AFTER THOROUGH REVIEW AND CONSIDERATION OF THE VARIOUS CLOSURE OPTIONS, MY TEAM AND I HAVE COME TO THE CONCLUSION THAT WE FULLY SUPPORT THE IMPOUNDMENT CLOSURE PLAN SUBMITTED FOR THE EDWARDS POWER PLANT. THIS PROPOSED PLAN NOT ONLY MEETS ALL NECESSARY PROTECTION STANDARDS BUT ALSO OFFERS THE MOST POSITIVE ECONOMIC AND ECOLOGICAL BENEFITS TO OUR AREA.

ONE PARTICULARLY EXCITING ASPECT OF VISTRA CORP.'S PROPOSAL IS THE PLAN TO BUILD A NEW UTILITY-SCALE SOLAR INSTALLATION ON THE RECLAIMED ACRES AT THE IMPOUNDMENT SITE. THIS RENEWABLE ENERGY DEVELOPMENT WILL NOT ONLY CREATE GOOD-PAYING JOBS DURING ITS CONSTRUCTION BUT ALSO GENERATE PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE REGION ONCE OPERATIONAL. THE ADDITION OF NEW SOLAR AND ENERGY COLLECTION AND STORAGE CAPABILITIES WILL SIGNIFICANTLY ADVANCE OUR AREA'S RENEWABLE ENERGY RESOURCES. FURTHERMORE, UTILIZING A BROWNFIELD ACRE AT A FORMER COAL PLANT SITE FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY MEANS PRESERVING LAND THAT COULD BE USED FOR AGRICULTURE OR CONSERVATION PURPOSES.

IN CONTRAST, I STRONGLY OPPOSE THE ALTERNATIVE PLAN OF CLOSURE BY REMOVAL OF THE EDWARDS POWER PLANT COAL ASH DUE TO THE SUBSTANTIAL NEGATIVE IMPACTS IT WOULD HAVE ON OUR SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES. TRANSPORTING THE COAL ASH TO ANOTHER LOCATION POSES SIGNIFICANT RISKS AND CHALLENGES. ESTIMATIONS SUGGEST THAT APPROXIMATELY 321,000 TRUCKLOADS WOULD NEED TO BE TRANSPORTED OFFSITE, COVERING A STAGGERING 13.5 MILLION MILES ON OUR LOCAL ROADS AND HIGHWAYS TO REACH AN OFFSITE COMMERCIAL LANDFILL. THIS EXTENSIVE TRANSPORTATION EFFORT WOULD CREATE SAFETY CONCERNS ON ALREADY STRESSED ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE. TRUCKS INVOLVED IN THE REMOVAL OPERATION ARE ANTICIPATED TO PASS BY EVERY 3 TO 4 MINUTES, FOR 10 HOURS A DAY, POTENTIALLY FOR UP TO 15 YEARS. THE CLOSURE BY REMOVAL PLAN WOULD BURDEN THE REGION WITH INCREASED TRAFFIC, SAFETY RISKS, ROAD WEAR AND TEAR, NOISE, AND DIESEL POLLUTION. ADDITIONALLY, EXCAVATION AND TRANSPORTATION OF 4.4 MILLION CUBIC YARDS OF COAL ASH ACROSS PUBLIC ROADS CARRIES INHERENT RISKS THAT CAN BE AVOIDED BY PROPERLY CONTAINING AND ENCLOSING THE MATERIAL ON THE SITE OF THE FORMER COAL PLANT.

FOR ALL THESE REASONS, I WHOLEHEARTEDLY SUPPORT THE IMPOUNDMENT CLOSURE PLAN SUBMITTED BY THE EDWARDS POWER PLANT AND STRONGLY ENCOURAGE ITS PERMITTING BY THE AGENCY. THANK YOU FOR YOUR ATTENTION TO THIS MATTER.

Picking up and moving the coal ash to another location presents its own unique risks and challenges. The intensity of removal operations under this alternative closure plan would broadly impact my District in ways that would diminish the quality of life for residents that live near the plants or the coal ash transportation corridors.

Based on the volume of material needing to be transported offsite under closure by removal, approximately 321,000 truckloads would travel 13.5 million miles on our local roads and highways to transport the coal ash to the offsite commercial landfill. At any point along the coal ash transportation route, a truck involved in the removal operation would pass by every 3 to 4 minutes, 10 hours a day, for up to 15 years. This would cause increased traffic and safety risk, wear and tear on roads, noise, and diesel pollution in the region. There are inherent risks with the excavation and transportation of 4.4 million cubic yards of coal ash across public roads that are not present when the material is left and properly enclosed on site of the former coal plant. I encourage the Agency to weigh the negative impacts of closure by removal and the local opposition to this alternative proposal.

The Edwards Power Plant's proposed impoundment closure plan attains all protection standards. Additionally, Vistra Corp.'s Illinois subsidiaries have proposed to build a new utility-scale solar installation atop the reclaimed acres at the impoundment. The renewable development will create good paying jobs during its construction and contribute property taxes for the region once operational. Every brownfield acre reused at a coal plant site for renewables is an acre preserved for other uses, such as agriculture or conservation.

I support the impoundment closure plan submitted by the Edwards Power Plant and encourage its permitting by the Agency.






