July 2025 Updated Information Regarding Concerns of Residents
Associated with the Closure Alternatives
[Illinois Administrative Code Section 845.710(b)(4)]

This document presents an addendum to the Closure Alternatives Assessment (CAA) for the Primary Ash Pond (PAP) at Illinois Power Generating Company's (IPGC) Newton Power Plant property near the City of Newton, Illinois, which was submitted to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) in July 2022 (Gradient, 2022). The CAA was prepared to meet the requirements of Section 845.710 of the Illinois Administrative Code (Title 35, Subtitle G, Chapter I, Subchapter j, Part 845; IEPA, 2021), which requires the development of a CAA prior to undertaking closure activities. The CAA evaluated three specific closure scenarios for the PAP: Closure-in-Place (CIP) with coal combustion residual (CCR) excavation and consolidation, Closure-by-Removal with On-Site CCR Disposal (CBR-Onsite), and Closure-by-Removal with Off-Site CCR Disposal (CBR-Offsite). A wide range of criteria – including the efficiency, reliability, and ease of implementation of the closure scenario, and its potential positive and negative short- and long-term impacts on human health and the environment – were used to evaluate the three closure scenarios (Gradient, 2022; IEPA, 2021).

One specific requirement of Section 845.710 of the Illinois Administrative Code [845.710(b)(4)] relates to the ability of the closure scenario to address concerns raised by the local community:

The closure alternatives analysis must examine the following for each closure alternative... [t]he degree to which the concerns of the residents living within communities where the CCR will be handled, transported and disposed of are addressed by the closure method (IEPA, 2021).

The CAA submitted in 2022 (Gradient, 2022) evaluated the closure alternatives with respect to this requirement and concluded that all three closure scenarios addressed residents' concerns regarding impacts to groundwater and surface water quality. The CAA identified CIP as the most appropriate closure scenario for the PAP based on all criteria that were evaluated consistent with the requirements of Section 845.710. A public meeting was held on May 24, 2022, during which the results of the CAA were discussed, and community questions were answered.

Since the initial submission of the CAA, IPGC has received hundreds of letters from residents, labor organizations, and town officials who live in communities near the Site and along adjacent transportation corridors. Through these letters, local community members have shown overwhelming support for the CIP alternative and raised concerns regarding the activities associated with the CBR-Offsite alternative. An addendum to the CAA conveying the local community's strong preference for the CIP alternative was submitted to the IEPA in 2024 (Gradient, 2024).

After the initial addendum was prepared, IPGC has continued to receive letters from residents who live in communities near the Site and along adjacent transportation corridors (Figure A.1). These letters (received since the submission of the 2024 addendum), which are attached at the end of this addendum, continue to voice support for the CIP alternative and raise concerns associated with the CBR-Offsite alternative.

Specifically, local residents consider the CIP closure plan to be "responsible," "viable," and "better" than the CBR-Offsite alternative. On the other hand, residents are concerned about the "inherent hazards" (e.g., increase in traffic, safety risk, noise and air pollution) associated with the CBR-Offsite scenario, which would involve removing and transporting millions of cubic yards of coal ash off-site over a period of 15 years. They note that "[t]here is a better way that does not involve the risks associated with hauling hundreds of thousands of truckloads of material through our communities" (e.g., see letter by Miss Pamela from Newton, IL). In particular, many residents who live along the potential truck haul routes are concerned about these risks and have voiced their concerns (Figure A.1).

As can be seen from the attached letters, the local community continues to overwhelmingly support the CIP alternative.




